

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee - or of Tiberias - and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover. Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, "Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?" He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, "Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each." One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, "There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?" Jesus said to them, "Make the people sit down." There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, "Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted." So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, "This really is the prophet who is to come into the world." Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself

COVID-19 Step 4 Guidance

The important step to take during this period is to ensure a safe environment in our places of worship and other buildings where activities take place within our parish. This will be a collective responsibility of everyone, especially those involved in the daily life of our parish as the safeguarding of public health now lies with the management of each organization. In the absence of the 'rule of law,' we strongly emphasise on common sense and risk averse activities to continue to mitigate against transmission of the virus which is still prevalent in society. To this effect, we are urged to take note of the following as the route to take in our parish from July 19.

- 1. Hand sanitisation shall continue and we shall continue to observe good cleaning regime as we have always done.
- 2. We strongly advise the use of face coverings while at Mass and withing our ancillary buildings.
- 3. Please, leave one seating space between you and a non-member of your family.
- 4. Congregational singing can now take place at Masses. It is highly recommended we do this with the masks on until infection levels reduce.

- 5. Our parish church will now open Monday to Saturday (8am-7.30pm) for private prayers.
- 6. The Weekday 12:10pm Mass can now have parishioners in attendance.
- 7. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will hold on Wednesday from 1245pm to 6pm; Saturday 10:45am to 12noon with the various devotions; Sunday 4pm to 5:45pm.
- 8. Holy Water is provided now in the dispenser for those who come with their small bottles for this sacramental.
- 9. We shall resume offertory collection at Masses. We however encourage parishioners to do more of online donation, register for standing order donation and gift aid if they pay taxes.
- 10. Holy Communion will be given under one kind and is recommended to be received on the hand. However, those who wish to receive on the tongue are free to do so as long as the ministers are careful of contamination. We shall continue the practice of being ushered for communion by the stewards pew by pew from the front.
- 11. Baptism is still one child or family at a time but with no limit to numbers attending.
- No restrictions on numbers attending Marriages as well as Funerals.
- 13. We shall resume home visits by priests, deacon and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy communion.
- 14. Social activities can resume in the parish; so also, catechetical and group activities.
- 15. Liturgical Ministers can take up their roles again: Choristers, Lectors, EHMC and Altar Servers. We however request that Old and would be Altar Servers are to register for serving. Forms are at the back of the church for this registration and once the forms are returned, we shall commence training sessions.
- 16. Parish Surgery for Baptisms, Marriages, Signing of School forms, etc shall hold henceforth on Tuesdays & Fridays 9am-12:30pm; 2pm-4:30pm
