

REFLECTION: TRINITY SUNDAY

In the Church's choice of readings for us today, the objective above all is to bathe us in God's love and in the truth of his Word. That happens to be the root of how to understand the Holy Trinity - a relationship of pure love and truth between the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit which - quite remarkably - is shared with us mere creatures. The reality of the Trinity as three divine persons in one God is revealed to us through the words of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus himself. If we trust him as true God and true man, then we believe his words and accept his promises. Behind us last Sunday we have Pentecost (the sending to us of the Holy Spirit); ahead of us we have Corpus Christi (the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ). Today we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity. All these feasts show us the action of the Trinity in the mission of Christ to show us how to love, to save us from sin and death, and to lead us to eternal life with God. We don't have to understand how God does it! If we were to understand God and all his ways, he would not be God! We are simply called to enjoy what he does for us and to keep his Commandments.

It is remarkable that the Apostles themselves and the early Christians were exposed directly by Jesus to what we call the Trinitarian formula for Baptism here at the end of the Gospel of Matthew. While the word "Trinity" was adopted later by the Church Fathers, the concept of the three persons in one God came directly from Christ, presaged in the Old Testament, and was shared with the Apostles. At every stage of Christ's mission, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit were involved as three persons in one God: at the incarnation, baptism, transfiguration, passion, death, resurrection and ascension. And through the action of the Holy Spirit, making present to us the sacrifice of the Son to the Father at Holy Mass, we partake in the divine life of the Trinity by receiving Holy Communion, to this day and to the end of time.
