Second Reading Romans 5:12-15

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

The church now opens for individual prayer on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays from 1pm to 5pm, and Sundays from 2pm to 5pm.

Some members of our parish have signed up to be stewards, to help in directing you as you come into the church to pray. We have made all provision for a safe, socially distanced, hygienic and cleaned church which meets the Southwark Archdiocesan Re-opening Guidance.

If you are able, you are most welcome to visit the church and pray. We do ask that you observe all the requirement and follow the

signage regarding entrance and exit, hand sanitisation, socially distanced seating, movement and direction in the church.

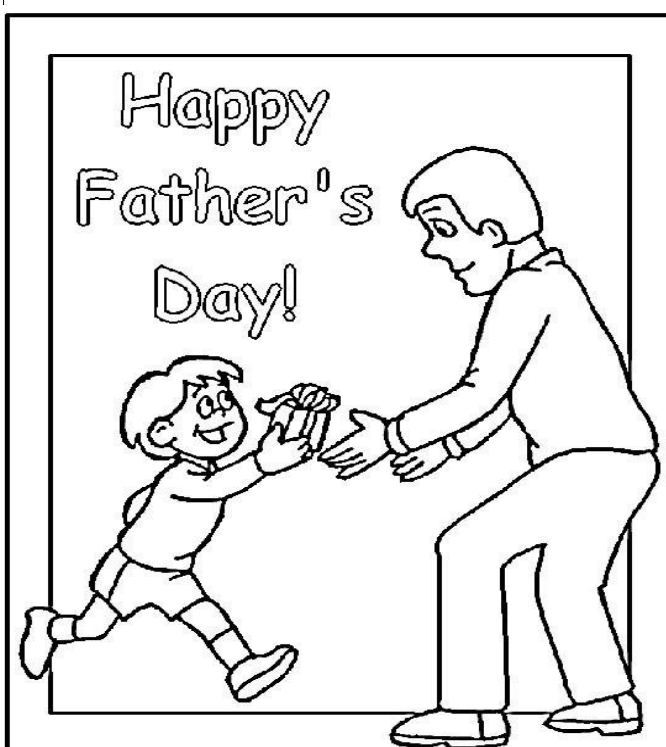
Just a gentle reminder that this is for silent, individual prayer only. Parents need to accompany and supervise their young people who are under 16 years of age so that the family remain together. We regret that there are no toilet facilities owing to infection control and there are no other usual parish activities or accessible areas.

If possible, we do ask that you try to come on the hour for your prayer because whilst the church will be kept cleaned during the opening, we will specifically clean every 45 minutes so that the church is free and the areas are cleaned and ready for hourly arrivals and those waiting.

We will fully clean the church at 5pm when the daily session ends and to aid this, the last admittance time will be 4.50pm.

All our live stream Masses and Prayers are still taking place online. We especially want to extend a very warm welcome to all those from the parish and further, even overseas, participating online in the Holy Mass, Adoration, Rosary and the Divine Office. We continue to welcome you as part of our parish community.
