Pope Francis has asked the whole Catholic World worldwide to engage in a process of discernment under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. This process is called a Synod. It involves everyone in the Churchclergy, religious and lay Catholics, each participating according to the gifts and charisms of their vocation. The theme of the synod is: 'For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission,' and its purpose is to help us grow together and so equip us to call more men and women to enter into life with the Lord Jesus. We shall have to listen as individuals and together to the Holy Spirit as we begin this encounter. The process shall be facilitated here in the parish by Nisha D'Silva and Theresa Okafor. The Archbishop will declare the discussions open at the Cathedral today and at 4pm engage with parish delegates across the diocese in a zoom session.
