Currently abortion is allowed up to birth for babies with disabilities. The Bill will change the law to clarify that cleft palate, cleft lip and club foot are not grounds for abortion in the UK. NOVEMBER DECEASED LIST: In the month of November we remember especially our departed brothers and sisters, friends and relatives. There are Holy souls envelopes at the entrance of the church. Enclose the list of names in an envelope together with your offering and place in the Holy Souls box. We shall place all the listed names on the Altar and

say at least one Mass a day for those souls in the month of November.

HOLY WATER: Anyone in need of holy water should bring water in a container to any of the priests for blessing. What are the benefits derivable from the use of holy water?

- 1. Holy water is used in driving away the devil. St Teresa of Avila says: I often experience that there is nothing that devils flee from more without returning than holy water."
- 2. Holy water is used to overcome temptations. In the rite of blessing of holy water, the priest prays that: "every fantasy and wickedness of the devil and unclean spirits, may fly and depart."
- 3. We can use holy water to drive away sickness and seek protection against future illness too
- 4. Holy water cleanses the soul from venial sins and temporal punishments. St Thomas Aquinas teaches: "By the sprinkling of Holy Water the debt of venial sin is wiped out; but not always, however, are all temporal punishments relinquished.
- 5. With the use of holy water, one can obtain actual graces from God. These graces help us to focus our minds on God in prayer, gain more graces from attending Mass, and live out our state of life and vocation more faithfully.
