REFLECTION

It's the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. We are in the second circle of Sunday Liturgical Cycle—a year dedicated to journeying with Jesus as shown to us by Mark. But before we begin to open the pages of the Gospel according to Mark, the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time in the three-year cycle takes us into the account of St John. Here, we

meet John the Baptist pointing Jesus out as the Lamb of God. Two of his disciples, Andrew and an unnamed fellow left John the Baptist immediately to go after the Lamb, the Rabbi who extended and invitation to them to come and see where he lived, his abode. The abode of God is the heavens. yet he has come down to live in each and everyone who listens to him and hears the invitation to follow him. The Incarnate Word of God wants to lead us back to his Father. That's the reason he came, to wed heaven and earth together and present a new creation to God. We have become one with God at our baptism. Each day we must listen to him as he unfolds his plan of grace to us. We must stay with him in prayer and meditate daily on his word. Like Samuel, our actions must sav to God: 'Speak Lord, I am listening.' And when he has made his will known to us, we must become his witnesses, spreading the goodness everywhere we go.
