

REFLECTION

It's the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. Last Sunday, as on every second Sunday of Ordinary time, we heard the testimony of John pointing the Lamb of God for us to follow. Andrew and the unnamed disciple followed the Lamb and they became the first fruits of the new creation as each of them went from the Lord to invite their brothers into the company of the Lamb.

The third Sunday begins the formal opening of the pages of the Gospel dedicated for our reflection during this Year B cycle of liturgical celebrations. This year, our journey will begin and progress at the invitation of the evangelist, St Mark. He opens his presentation in this words: 'The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God' (1:1). This invitation from Mark to all of us to come and discover the goodness of life the Son of God freely offers to those who heed his call is quickly followed by the ministry of John the Baptist, Jesus' baptism and the accompanying theophany—the revealing of Jesus as God's beloved Son, and lastly, the temptation of Jesus in the wilderness. And as soon as these events are over Mark draws the curtain on John's ministry, opening up the ministry of Jesus with his account of the call of his first four disciples. That is the context of the text of the gospel read at Mass this Sunday.

Mark is quick to point out the correlation between the message of John and that of Jesus: it is a call to repentance in preparation for the coming of the kingdom of God. Jesus is inviting each one of us in the same manner as he calls Simon, Andrew, James and John . He wants to lead us into the kingdom of God, the home of the Father. In order to follow Jesus, we must leave behind us our old unprofitable lives: our sins; our

unfaithfulness; our lack of desire for God and lack of love for our brothers and sisters. We must experience a new conversion, just like Jonah did in the first reading. This new conversion, a turning around and away from sin is a condition for following the Lord. In the second reading, St Paul invites us as he did the Corinthian church to lose no time in heeding the call of the Gospel and make use of same message for the renewal and purification of our lives.

Today is Sunday of the Word of God. In declaring the third Sunday in ordinary time as Sunday of the Word of God, Pope Francis wants us to "appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people (which) can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before world" (Apperuit Illis 2). I urge you, beloved in Christ, to fall in love with the Bible and let God enlighten our hearts and our ways this vear. Let us make the effort to read at least a page of the Bible a day and discover how Jesus wants us to share in his mission.
