

REFLECTION

The healing ministry of Jesus progresses as shown in today's gospel text. The world of Mark is one troubled by all sorts of inexplicable realities that keep humanity bothered: demonic possessions rank as highly disturbing; there were disease conditions that were hard to fathom. Last Sunday, Jesus was presented as healing a woman who suffered from a fever and of course all who were sick and tormented by devils. His fame was spreading like wild fire but he was yet to hit at the root of the most devastating disease condition of his time: leprosy! In that ancient time, leprosy was most dreaded, just like humanity in our own time is threatened by the COVID 19 plague. Interestingly the two disease conditions have something in common: to cure it or prevent its spread, the afflicted must isolate or be isolated. Thanks to modern medicine, leprosy can now be curtailed/treated and even the COVID 19 plague in its various mutants is being studied to the level of making vaccination possible for preventing infection and lessening the impact of a possible infection. Treatment of this disease also gets better compared to when it first began. We ought to know by now better than the ancient people who linked leprosy to punishment for sins committed that the virus is not God's anger for sins committed.

However as scary as these disease conditions are, there is something scarier, SIN. It's the deadliest and the worst of diseases that can afflict humanity. We cover our faces with masks; we wash our hands and keep distance from those not of our household; we isolate from those we think have come in contact with a sick person yet and ironically too, we romance with sin and all its deadly symptoms roaming freely in our environment!

What shall we do then? Let us follow the example of the leper who approached Jesus with faith as he said: 'If you want to, you can cure me.' Let us acknowledge the power of Jesus Christ to save us by curing us of sin and other ailments of the mind, body or soul. He will set us free so we can live our lives bearing testimony to his power and love. The testimony we shall give would begin from a personal examination of conscience and a perfect act of contrition. If we need sacramental confession then we seek out a priest and arrange for one where we can actually besiege God and say: Cure me Father, for you can.
